
Immigration Policy and Child Health: An Update

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Children in Immigrant Families



Key Updates

- Immigration raids and enforcement actions
- Rescission of "protected areas"
- "Closure" of the border to people seeking humanitarian protection
- Prolonged stays in ORR custody
- Challenges to birthright citizenship
- Cuts to health and nutrition programs
- Restricted eligibility for public programs
- Widespread fear and uncertainty



Some Protections that Persist


- HIPAA

Health Coverage for Immigrant Children

LAST UPDATED JULY 2025

- Medicaid/CHIP for lawfully residing children, regardless of date of entry
- Medical coverage for children, regardless of immigration status



South Carolina has taken the CHIPRA state option to cover lawfully residing children and pregnant people without a 5-year waiting period.

Immigration Enforcement

- Healthcare institutions no longer "protected areas"
- Some protections exist:
 - HIPAA
 - 4th Amendment: unreasonable search and seizure
- Ethical obligations of healthcare institutions are clear
 - Private areas
 - Designated staff
 - Updated institutional policies

Participation in Safety Net Programs

- On July 14, 2025, HHS added 13 programs to list of "federal public benefits," restricting participation in key programs based on immigration status
- Programs include:
 - Head Start
 - Health Center program (e.g. FQHCs)
 - Title X family planning
- Enforcement delayed until 9/11/25 for ALL states

Common Concerns We are Hearing

- Families feeling unsafe sending children to school
 - Children are targeted for bullying
 - Concerns about ICE in car lines
- Caregivers worrying that they are cannot apply for WIC/SNAP/Medicaid for their children
- New fear of going to doctor appointments as medical facilities are no longer "Safe Spaces"
- Calls with questions on if they should go to their immigration court hearings
- Reports of less work available for undocumented parents which affects family income
- Not having anyone to name as POA for children if parent were to be deported
- Parents of children with medical complexity asking how to make sure their child will continue receiving care if the parents are no longer in the country (deported)
- Pantheon of struggles after deportation of one parent which changes family into a single parent household

School concerns

- Connecting with family and bringing in trusted school social workers if needed.
- Discussing how not sending children to school could cause truancy issues.
- Making sure there is reliable transportation for students.
- Showing caregivers the pathway to communicate with someone at the school in Spanish

Medical concerns

- Explaining the hospital's policies on privacyoffering to take patient back to wait out of "public space"
- Helping connect for POA documentation in cases of children with more severe medical needs,
- Helping set up virtual appointments
- Offering in-home therapies with Babynet
- Reminding families that they are ALWAYS entitled to an interpreter

Financial concerns

 Connecting families with local agencies and supports like youth base, food banks, WIC, clothes closets, hospital sponsorship (Unfortunately, there are huge gaps in resources available to undocumented families)

Legal

concerns

- Connecting to locally vetted immigration attorneys
- Sharing POA events with Hispanic Alliance
- Referring to Medical Legal Partnership in cases where one of the parents is documented
- Encouraging families to make an emergency plan together before something happens
- Sharing Know your Rights resources
