Legislative advocacy updates

- Check out the <u>legislative update</u> as of 4/20/23 shared by the incredible Maggie Cash.
- We continue to oppose <u>S.109</u> & <u>H.3594</u> "constitutional carry." H.3594 includes a provision that would allow a CWP holder that is 18 or older to have a firearm in a "secure" glovebox, etc. of a car on a school campus- but if that bill receives review in the Senate, we will have several opportunities to advocate against that provision. Dr. Martha Edwards testified on 4/5/23 against S.109. S 109 didn't make crossover. H 3594 did come out of the House, but it hasn't come out of the Senate Judiciary Committee.
- We continue to work with stakeholders on identifying mutually agreeable edits to <u>H.3309</u> (seizure safe schools) about the role of pediatricians and pediatric subspecialists in managing children with epilepsy in schools.
- SCAAP signed onto this **gun violence prevention research funding** <u>letter</u> along with 400 other orgs and it was delivered to US House/Senate offices on 4/19/23
- Led by Dr. Kent Jones in partnership with geneticists and other advocates, the chapter supported <u>S.394</u> focused on providing more timely care when abnormal results appear on **newborn screens**...Dr. Skinner testified, and the bill passed the Senate with a vote of 42-0 on 2/22/23. The <u>house version</u> was introduced on 2/16/23 and was referred to 3M. It was scheduled for a subcommittee hearing 4/26/23 where Dr. Skinner again testified, and the bill passed out favorably with a unanimous vote to full committee. It passed out of full 3M committee favorably on 5/2/23. **S.394 on 5/4/23 was passed by the House by a vote of 108-0!!!** The bill will receive third reading 5/5/23 and be enrolled for ratification (both chambers sign the bills). - We continue to oppose <u>S.627</u>, which proposes a gender affirming care ban for children under 18yo and forces schools to our children before they are ready. We testified against this bill on 3/23/23 in Senate Medical Affairs. For now, it appears this will not move this session but will likely be taken up next session.
- We continue to support the **hate crime** penalty enhancement bill <u>H.3014</u> and have asked that it be put up for special order this session.
- We support <u>H.4122</u>, which would improve **access to lifesaving meds**, including epinephrine autoinjectors, naloxone, etc in school.
- We continue to oppose <u>S.505</u> & <u>H.3988</u>, which would allow pharmacists and pharmacy techs to test and provide treatment for certain diagnoses and would lower the age for pharmacists to provide routine vaccinations to 12 from 18yo.
- We continue to oppose <u>H.3681</u> & <u>S.414</u> **tobacco preemption** bills, which take away the rights of local communities to pass important policies to prevent and reduce youth tobacco use. Call your legislators using <u>this link</u> and use the script.


